Introduction

The Ladybug mat kit will allow you to show off your talents with a really cute design.

May you find inspiration in our kits to bring your own unique brand of style into your home.

Care Instructions: All of the wool felt in our kits is a blend of 20-35% wool. Dry cleaning is recommended for cleaning. To press wool felt, use a steam iron on high.

Stitches Needed

French Knot



Insert needle from the back side and wrap 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 turns around the needle as shown. The more turns the bigger the knot. You can experiment on a scrap piece of fabric to see which size you



Backstitch

This stitch creates a line of 1/8" stitches on the top



of the fabric that are equal in length with no spaces between. Knot one end and start from the back side up through to the front at position 1. Pass the needle down in position 2, up in 3, down in 4, up in 5 down in 6, and so on to make the stitch.

Chain Stitch

Insert needle from rear side ito the front. Then reinsert it as shown a short distance away with the loop under the needle. Pull tight to form the first link and repeat.

Blanket Stitch

To make a Blanket Stitch, thread a needle with the floss and knot one of the two ends of thread.

The starter stitch begins between the two layers of wool felt. The needle is inserted between two layers, then down through the bottom layer and up over the tail.

Pull the thread tight which will set the knot between the layers.

Insert the needle down into the fabric,

through both layers, and up inside the loop. Then, pull tight.

Repeat this along the edge of the fabric until you have completed the edging.

The stitching should be evenly spaced and have the loop along the seam between the two piece.

Instructions

The Ladybug Parade Mat Kit has 8 ladybugs dancing around the mat. Refer to the box image for layout.

Design Side

Layout the ladybugs bodies and wings to match the box cover. Pin the black bodies onto one layer of the mat and remove the wings. Blanket stitch the bodies to the mat. Chain stitch the antennes on each ladybug.

Add the red wings to the lady bug bodies by blanket stitching, make sure to spread the wings before you stitch. Add French knots to the wings and cream French knots for the eyes.

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
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Repeat this along the edge of the fabric until you have completed the edging.

The stitching should be evenly spaced and have the loop along the seam between the two piece.

Instructions

The Ladybug Garden Mat Kit has 10 ladybugs scattered around the mat. Refer to the box image for layout.

Design Side

Layout the ladybugs bodies and wings to match the box cover. Pin the black bodies onto one layer of the mat and remove the wings. Blanket stitch the bodies to the mat. Chain stitch the antennes on each ladybug.

Add the red wings to the lady bug bodies by blanket stitching, make sure to spread the wings before you stitch. Add French knots to the wings and cream French knots for the eyes.

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Stitches Needed

French Knot

Insert needle from the back side and wrap 1, 2, 3, 4

or 5 turns around the needle as shown. The more turns the bigger the knot. You can experiment on a scrap piece of fabric to see which size you like best.



Add a ladybug trail by using a back stitch or a running stitch.

Assembly

Pin the 2nd base layer behind the first. Stitch along the outside edge of the mat using a Blanket Stitch.

Using red floss, bring your needle up from the back in the location of the center of the flower. Fold a heart petal in half and pierce it at the tip, threading it onto the floss. Repeat for each heart. Then go back through the mat where the floss came up. Spread the petals out and come back making three simple stitches for the veins in the petal. Repeat for the remaining flowers.

Assembly

Pin the 2nd base layer behind the first. Stitch along the outside edge of the mat using a Blanket Stitch.

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
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
