Introduction

This heart needle book is decorated with Ladybugs. Did you know that in some countries the Ladybug is called a Lady Bird?

Care Instructions: All of the wool felt in our kits is a blend of 20-35% wool. Dry cleaning is recommended for cleaning. To press wool felt, use a steam iron on high.

Stitches Needed

Blanket Stitch


Thread the needle with floss and knot only one of the two ends.

The needle is inserted between two layers, then down through the bottom laver and up over the tail.

Pull the thread tight which will set the knot between the layers.

Insert the needle down into the fabric, through both layers, and up inside the loop. Then, pull tight.

Repeat this along the edge of the fabric until you have completed the edging.



Insert needle from the back side and wrap 1, 2, 3, 4

The stitching should be evenly spaced and have

or 5 turns around the needle as shown. The more turns the bigger the knot. You can experiment on a scrap piece of fabric to see which size you like best.

Instructions

Assembly

Take one of the large Heart Needle Book bases and pin two ladybug bodies to the front as shown on the cover. Pin in place the wings on each ladybug and the two leaves. Do not add the hearts to make the flower at this point.

Blanket Stitch the outer edge of the ladybug bodies and wings to the base wth black floss. Add French knots to make the black spots. Add the eyes using white French knots.

Using black floss, add a small chain stitch to make the antenna of each ladybug.

Use a running stitch to make the trails showing where the ladybug has been.

Attach the green leaves to the base using a running stitch forming a single vein down the middle of each leaf. Add four small hearts using three simple stitches to make the violet flower.

Take the second base and pin the pages to the one half of the base. (Note: When folded and joined to the other base, this will be on the inside back flap and under the top flap with the three hearts).

Blanket Stitch the top edge of the pages to the base with the matching or contrasting color floss.

Pin the two bases together so that when folded, heart stack is on the top and the needle book pages are on the inside back. Lay the needle book on a table with the heart stack facing up (just like on the

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Blanket Stitch

Thread the needle with floss and knot only one of the two ends.

Insert the needle down into the fabric, through both layers, and up inside the loop. Then, pull tight.

French Knot

Insert needle from the back side and wrap 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 turns around the needle as shown. The more turns the bigger the knot. You can experiment on a scrap piece of fabric to see which size you



Instructions

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Blanket Stitch the top edge of the pages to the base with the matching or contrasting color floss.

Pin the two bases together so that when folded, heart stack is on the top and the needle book pages are on the inside back. Lay the needle book on a table with the heart stack facing up (just like on the cover), open the needle book and you should see the needle pages face up. If they are not, you will need to un-pin and rotate the inner base to the correct orientation. Once you have confirmed the layout, blanket stitch the outside edges and the innner square.
